I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. 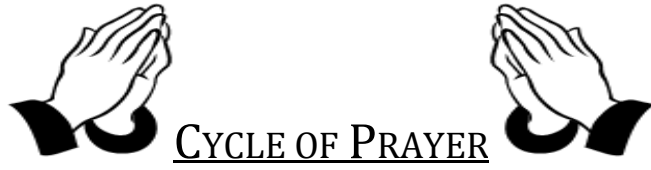
